We were also able to provide unprecedented outreach, with Hamilton artists engaging with the community through events at Lincoln City Libraries, the Malone Center, local schools, and the Lancaster County Juvenile Detention Center. In September, our season opened with a spectacular sold-out show with The Blues Brothers featuring Dan Aykroyd and Jim Belushi, and that same weekend also saw the kickoff of our piano series with the legendary Emanuel Ax debuting the Lied's brand-new 9-foot Steinway Model D Concert Grand Piano. Ax himself traveled to the Steinway & Sons Factory with a Lied Center delegation over the summer to select the world-class instrument, which will be part of unforgettable performances for decades to come.

Now we continue into the groundbreaking new season, which will also feature our first-ever movie/concert experiences with Spider-Man: Into the Spider-Verse - Live in Concert on Oct. 29 and Coco in Concert on Nov. 1! Each of these events will feature the full movies being played on our giant screen while live musicians perform all the music on stage. They're going to be unique, immersive experiences that are also an amazing opportunity to introduce our youngest audiences to the wonders of live orchestral music. Costumes welcome!

Of course, none of these achievements would be possible without our Friends. Because of the support of so many arts lovers from all across the state of Nebraska, we're breaking new ground, providing ever-more impactful arts experiences, and changing lives through the joy of the arts. He is on the board of directors for Nebraskans for the Arts and the Hixson-Lied College of Fine & Performing Arts Alumni Board.



Lied Center Unveils New 9-Foot Steinway Concert Grand Piano

When legendary eight-time GRAMMY Award-winning pianist Emanuel Ax performed on the Lied Center stage on Sunday, Sept. 24, his spectacular concert also marked the debut of the Lied Center's new Steinway piano. This "once-in-a-generation purchase" was personally selected by Ax specifically for the Lied Center.

The Lied Center has built a reputation of presenting the world's top pianists, and attracting internationally renowned artists requires providing world-class instruments for their performances. Thanks to generous support from the D.F. Dillon Foundation and Rhonda Seacrest, Emanuel Ax traveled to the Steinway & Sons Factory in Queens, N.Y., to select a new 9-foot Steinway Model D Concert Grand piano for the Lied. He was joined at the factory by Lied Center Executive Director Bill Stephan, Glenn Korff School of Music Professor Paul Barnes, UNL Chancellor Emeritus Ronnie Green, and Lied Center Piano Circle Member Keith Heckman.

Stephan said, "From Emanuel Ax to Yuja Wang, Van Cliburn himself to Van Cliburn International Piano Competition Gold Medalists, the Lied Center has established itself as one of the world's top presenters of classical piano concerts and recitals. We could not be more excited to add this spectacular Steinway instrument to Lied Center concert experiences and are so grateful to the wonderful donors

who made it possible. Because of their generosity, Nebraskans will continue to experience the world's greatest classical musicians for many years to come!"

Ax's performance kicked off the 2023-2024 Lied Center Piano Series, which will also include a return performance by Lied Center audience favorite Behzod Abduraimov on Dec. 5 and a concert featuring Jon Nakamatsu, the only American to win a gold medal at the Van Cliburn International Piano Competition in more than four decades, on April 7.

The Lied's concert grand Steinway piano that has been used in performances since the building opened in 1990 will continue to be available for concerts and other events throughout the year.

Students are the Superstars at Lied Summer Camps

Tony Award®-winning music director Jason Michael Webb and acting coach Q Smith headlined our staff of teaching artists for the weeklong Lied Center Triple Threat Broadway Intensive musical theater camp for high school students held June 25-29. Webb was recently nominated for his second Tony Award® for his work on the new Broadway hit MJ: The Musical. Q Smith is a Native Nebraskan and was in the original Broadway cast of the Tony Award®-winning musical Come From Away. Nebraska native Katie Pohlman returned to the Intensive as our dance instructor. Katie served as swing and dance captain on the national tour of the Broadway musical Bandstand.

We were thrilled to welcome 42 students at the Intensive this summer! We once again reached students across state lines, with participants hailing from Colorado and South Dakota. We had 17 students from Lincoln area schools and Nebraska students from communities such as Fremont, Norfolk, and Hastings. The impact of the Intensive has never been greater with participants who graduated high school in May moving on to prestigious theater programs across the country including The Hartt School at the University of Hartford and Northwestern University. After their week of learning, students entertained audiences on the Lied mainstage in their final showcase with a 35-minute Jason Michael Webb original musical SuperStar, along with solo performances of songs and monologues from the acting workshops.

The Lied Center Piano Academy took place July 17-21. Our featured guest artist was Dr. Solungga Liu, who holds a doctoral degree in Piano Performance from the Eastman School of Music. Liu is a Professor of Piano and Piano Area Coordinator in the College of Musical Arts at Bowling Green State University. Liu enjoys an active career across five continents and has collaborated with the likes of the National Theater Symphony Orchestra of Brazil and the National Institute of Health's Philharmonia in Washington D.C. The 2023 Academy was led by artistic director Dr. Paul

Barnes. Alongside Dr. Barnes, fellow Glenn Korff School of Music faculty David von Kampen and Tom Larsen taught workshops in music composition. UNL DMA graduate student Rebekah Stiles led a workshop and master classes, and another Nebraska piano performance graduate, Kaleb Wilkening, led workshops in music theory.

Students attended classes, workshops, and master classes throughout the week in Westbrook Music Building and at the Lied Center. Students also had the opportunity to attend two evening recitals performed by Rebekah Stiles and Solungga Liu. At the end of the week, Academy students shared their talents and progress in a recital for an invited audience of friends and family. We reached our maximum number of participants at 16 this year! We were thrilled to reach students across state lines, with participants hailing from Ohio and Georgia. One Academy alum returned as a counselor, another moved into full-time piano studies as a freshman at UNL studying piano performance, and several of this year's participants have since expressed strong interest in joining UNL's collegiate program.



Hamilton Outreach Takes Center Stage in August

While Hamilton was Lincoln's most-attended arts event in history, the show's impact extended well beyond the stage. During their 16-show run in Lincoln Aug. 3-13, the company participated in seven outreach opportunities in the community, offering insight into all areas of the production from backstage to center stage to the orchestra pit. In total, Hamilton outreach events served over **300 members** of the Lincoln community.

Malone Center | Ensemble member Anthony Santos conducted a beginner movement workshop and Q&A session at the Malone Center with 42 students grades 2-8 from their summer program. Participating students were able to see the production free of charge as part of the Lied's Performance Fund Program.

Bennett Martin Library | Lencia Kebede, who plays Angelica Schuyler, and stage manager Rolando Linares engaged in conversation with Bennett Martin Library Assistant Director Traci Glass in the inaugural Page to Stage program partnership with the Lincoln City Libraries. The 75 event attendees were also invited to ask Kebede and Linares questions.

Lied Center Vocal Master Class | Jared Howelton, who plays the principal roles of Marquis de Lafayette/Thomas Jefferson in the production, led a vocal master class at the Lied Center for six UNL and three high school musical theater students.

Lancaster County Youth Services Center | Ensemble member Nicole DeRoux, who plays "The Bullet," visited the Lancaster County Youth Services Center to engage 18 incarcerated youth aged 13-18 in a beginning movement workshop and Q&A session.

Lied Center Tech Q & A | Wardrobe Supervisor David B. Thompson and Production Stage Manager Jimmie Lee Smith held a costume and stage management Q&A session with 90 high school and 10 UNL students on the Lied main stage, sharing insights about working in technical theater and shining a light on the unseen talent that keeps a show like Hamilton running.

Carson Center Dance Master Class | Company dance captain Devin Tyler Hatch led a dance master class at the Carson Center for Emerging Media Arts. The class had 22 participants and focused on "My Shot," exploring not just choreography, but also characterization and storytelling through dance.

Pit Sit | Lastly, two UNL students and aspiring music directors were welcomed into the orchestra pit for the final two performances of the run to observe the conductor, orchestra, and pit activities during the show and make connections with professional touring musicians.

Mariachi Zapata to visit Eastern, Central Nebraska in November



Omaha-based Mariachi Zapata will visit Fremont, Nebraska City, Grand Island, and Kearney on their upcoming Arts Across Nebraska tour November 14-17, 2023. Delighting audiences since 1989, the group features a wide range of traditional instrumentation and focuses on presenting high quality performances of this 500-year-old music tradition, while keeping Mexican and Chicano culture alive. In addition to their entertaining performances, the group is committed to educational outreach work and connecting with students using their original curriculum on instrumental instruction, music appreciation, and history. Mariachi Zapata has been nominated for four Omaha Entertainment and Arts Awards, winning Best World Music in 2018.
