It's going to be a signature year for classical music at the Lied, with the return of the legendary **Itzhak Perlman**, the Lied premiere of the **Czech National Symphony Orchestra** with guest violinist **Sandy Cameron** (who last appeared on the Lied stage alongside Danny Elfman), the first performance of **Academy of St Martin in the Fields** at the Lied in nearly 20 years, and international sensation **Van Cliburn Gold Medalist Yunchan Lim**.

In an exciting and eclectic season of dance, the thrilling **Step Afrika!** returns to bring its newest production to the Lied stage and more exceptional outreach to the Lincoln community. The season continues with the iconic **Parsons Dance**, and then the electrifying **Syncopated Ladies** (who recently returned from touring with Beyonce!).

This year the holidays at the Lied will be bigger than ever with three major holiday shows: the Christmas musical stylings of **The Midtown Men** (the original stars of Jersey Boys!), the holiday-themed spectacle that is **The Illusionists: The Magic of the Holidays**, and the beloved family classic **A Charlie Brown Christmas: Live on Stage**!

All that is just scratching the surface of the electrifying 2024-2025 Lied Center season! We'll also welcome the return of Lied Center favorites including **Mnozil Brass**, the **Ukulele Orchestra of Great Britain**, **Capitol Fools**, **Alton Brown**, the world-premiere play **A House Divided**, and much more.

Nicki Collett, Senior Director of Advancement for The Tennessee Theater, flew to Lincoln to be a member of the Lied Center team for the day and a guest at this unique event.

Jazzy Ash makes connections in Pender and Kearney

Jazz musician Ashli St. Armant and pianist Doug Carter visited Pender and Kearney on April 17-18, 2024, engaging the communities with a combined two student matinees, one public performance, and two outreach events in the two communities over two days.

St. Armant led Pender 4-6 graders in a playground hand game workshop, explaining the cultural and musical significance of the games and giving students an opportunity to share their own. The student matinee was presented to all K-8 grade students at Pender Public Schools and got students and teachers alike on their feet dancing. The evening public performance featured classic jazz tunes and storytelling. A special thank you to Kat Ousey for tabling at this performance and spreading the word about the Lied Center and the work we do to reach all Nebraskans!

In Kearney, Jazzy Ash performed for all Kearney Public School fifth graders, with a select group joining her on stage to collaborate on the number When the Saints Go Marching In. She was also able to lead a community ukulele workshop for all ages, with some in attendance picking up a ukulele for the first time! In total, this tour served nearly 1,200 Nebraskans and was an inspiration to many.

In total, the 23-24 Arts Across Nebraska Season served **4,717 Nebraskans**, performing 9 student matinees, 7 public performances, and providing 9 outreach services in communities across Nebraska, traveling 1,773 miles. Thank you to the Friends of Lied for their support of this special program – we could not do it without you!





Inaugural Page to Stage partnership with Lincoln City Libraries a success

During the 2023-24 season, the Lied Center and Lincoln City Libraries teamed up to connect literary-themed Lied Center performances with library patrons. The fiveperformance program took place at the Bennett Martin Library and featured special events engaging artists from touring productions. Activities included conversations with performers and backstage personnel, special storytime guests, curated reading lists, ticket giveaways and more.

Highlights included moderated conversations with Lencia Kebede, who plays Angelica Schuyler in *Hamilton;* Matt Crowle and Victoria Huston-Elem, Thenardier and Madame Thenardier, respectively, in *Les Misérables;* as well as *To Kill A Mockingbird* national tour cast members Yaegel T. Welch, who plays Tom Robinson, Maeve Moynihan, who plays Scout Finch, and Justin Mark, who plays Jem.

For our younger patrons, puppeteers from Mermaid Theatre of Nova Scotia visited storytime with special puppet guest Rainbow Fish, sharing the books *Rainbow Fish* and *Rainbow Fish Discovers the Deep Sea*, featured in the performance. And, despite the cancellation of the show, cast member Theresa Cunningham was able to read Newbury Honor Recipient *Show Way* to families, while Lindy Clausen from the International Quilt Museum led children in a post-story art activity centered on quilting. This season, the partnership served nearly 200 Lincolnites.


Greater Nebraska Meeting
