ANOTHER SUMMER OF STUDENTS AND STARS AT THE LIED!

Tony Award®-winning music director Jason Michael Webb and acting coach Lelund Durond Thompson headlined our staff of teaching artists for the weeklong Lied Center Triple Threat Broadway Intensive musical theater camp for high school students held June 27-July 1, 2022. Webb was recently nominated for his second Tony Award® for his work on the new Broadway hit MJ: The Musical. Thompson has been busy working with actors on popular shows on CW Network, HBO Max, and Netflix. Nebraska native Katie Pohlman, who served as dance captain on the national tour of the Broadway musical Bandstand, returned as our dance teacher, and we rounded out our faculty with three teaching artists from local University theater programs: Ann Marie Pollard from University of Nebraska-Lincoln, Joel Egger from Doane University, and Ryan Kathman from Nebraska Wesleyan University.

We were thrilled to welcome a record-breaking 43 students at the Intensive this summer! We once again reached students across state lines, with participants hailing from Colorado, Missouri, South Dakota, and Texas. We had 22 students from Lincoln area schools and Nebraska students from communities such as Deshler, Sutton, Fremont, Norfolk, and Hastings. The impact of the Intensive has never been greater with participants who graduated high school in May moving on to prestigious theater programs across the country including Oklahoma City University, Pace University, and The Hartt School at the University of Hartford.

After their week of learning, students entertained audiences on the Lied mainstage in their final showcase with an ensemble song and dance medley, solo performances of songs and monologues, and videos from the acting workshops.





We also hosted the Lied Center Piano Academy on July 11-15, 2022. Our featured guest artist was the dynamic Jeannette Fang, who received her Doctor of Musical Arts from the University of Michigan and holds degrees from Juilliard and Yale. She is a member of the acclaimed Garth Newel Piano Quartet and has been featured at prestigious venues such as the Kennedy Center and Steinway Hall. The 2022 Academy was the second year under the artistic direction of Dr. Paul Barnes. Alongside Dr. Barnes, fellow Glenn Korff School of Music faculty David von Kampen and Tom Larsen taught workshops in music composition. Recent Nebraska DMA graduate Madeline Rogers led a workshop and master classes, and another Nebraska piano performance graduate, Kaleb Wilkening, led workshops in music theory. Students attended classes, workshops, and master classes throughout the week in Westbrook Music Building and at the Lied Center. Students also had the opportunity to attend two evening recitals performed by Jeannette Fang and Madeline Rogers. At the end of the week, Academy students shared their talents and progress in a recital for an invited audience of friends and family.

We reached our maximum number of participants at 16 this year! Two Academy alumni returned as counselors, another moved into full-time piano studies as a freshman at UNL studying piano performance, and several of this year's participants have since expressed strong interest in joining UNL's collegiate program. We look forward to their permanent return to campus as full-time students in the coming years!











CREATE

Hosted in the Lied Commons, **CREATE** was a week-long summer institute offered July 11-15, 2022, for teachers interested in integrating the arts into their teaching practice. The course emphasized teaching all the arts - dance, music, theater, visual arts - across the curriculum and featured national experts in the field, sampler/demonstrations of arts integration in action, experienced professional teaching artists, local performances, and museum arts visits. Twentyfive participants from across Nebraska participated and created arts-integrated learning experiences using a projectbased learning approach. We also learned about and practiced using a new assessment measure called "singlepoint assessment" or "single-point rubric." The course was offered for both undergraduate and graduate credit through UNL's Department of Teaching, Learning and Teacher Education.

Highlights include:

- An arts-integrated learning analysis of the performance of *Revelations* by Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater.
- Presentation of close reading strategies using characters from book *The Birchbark House* by Louise Erdrich.
- Presentations were made by the Arts Integration Leadership Team at the Umonhon Nation School about their partnership, and an arts education grant resource session was led by Anne Alston from the Nebraska Arts Council.
- A culminating song and reading led by indigenous artist Tanaya Winder, whose latest poetry book is *Words Like Love*.
- Visual Thinking Strategies were practiced looking at artworks in two Great Plains Center exhibits Contemporary Indigeneity and Star Body, Star Breath New work by Omaha Artist Sarah Rowe.
- Tableau performances were created using the book by Frederick Douglass The Narrative of the Life of Frederick Douglass: An American Slave.


