

ARTS ACROSS NEBRASKA:

Arts Across Nebraska Takes The Flyovers Soaring into Nebraska Communities!

The Lied Center for Performing Arts' Arts Across Nebraska tours bring the best in music, theater, and dance to communities across the state, and this November that included the high-energy acapella group The Flyovers soaring into Pender, Fremont, and Nebraska City. In Pender, 553 people enjoyed either the school performance or the public show. That's more than 50% of the entire population of the town!

The Flyovers are a modern a cappella quintet from Lincoln consisting of two tenors (Ether Saure and Lucas Kellison), a soaring soprano (Anna Claridge), a rumbling bass (Bill Catlett), and an impossible beatboxer (D-Wayne). Founded during the pandemic, the group has already released three albums (and are working on a fourth!) and have performed all over the state. Their Arts Across Nebraska tour included public concerts at the Pender Community Center, the





YOUNG LEADERS OF AMERICA FELLOW ALEJANDRA (ALEX) LIEVANO MAKES A GIANT IMPACT!

The Lied Center was very fortunate to have Alex (Alejandra) Lievano join us for a month this summer - from June 13-July 8, 2022. Alex was matched to the Lied Center through the Young Leaders of the America's program of the U.S. Department of State. As part of her fellowship, she worked with Lied staff to develop a plan to learn about our programs, with the goal of inspiring and enhancing her own work in the arts and economic development in the rural coastal areas of Columbia.

Alex came to Lincoln already with a brilliant work history work that involves deep roots in the rural coastal communities of Columbia, where she was born, and has already made a huge impact. In Columbia, she set up an Ancient Wisdom School that brings the expertise of community elders to children and youth in rural areas. She has written and designed a beautiful book entitled Hugging the Earth that has scrumptious, colorful photos depicting the plants of Columbia and how they are best used for food and healthy eating. She works with women in rural communities to establish the arts as a source of income/economic development, and shared photos and bestowed beautiful gifts, including her charming personality, on anyone she came in contact with in Lincoln and across Nebraska. She showed us beautiful silk purses and long sleeve swimsuits for women that were designed to handle the cold Columbian coastal waters and are produced in her community by the NGO she co-founded, Casa Mucura.

Alex took advantage of almost every opportunity while in Lincoln and Northeast Nebraska. She created a Moon/Night Calendar for the teachers in the Umonhon Nation School's Outdoor classroom. She helped weed the outdoor classroom/garden and prepared a wonderful Columbian meal for the Elders and teachers of the Umonhon Nation School in Macy, NE. While here, Alex attended Jazz in June concerts and mainstage performances that were touring through Lincoln in the summer.

She participated in a virtual arts education class offered by the Kennedy Center and has already applied what she learned to her work in Columbia. She met with several community arts organizations in Lincoln and greater Nebraska, including Flatwater Shakespeare Company, Art Bus LNK, and the Merryman Center for Performing Arts in Kearney. She helped construct a chapbook of Kwansaba poems (with Kennedy Center Teaching Artist Glenis Redmond) that students and teachers wrote, also designing a beautiful, bold cover for the chapbook. She soaked up the fiery Nebraska sun and humid days and immersed herself in every experience that crossed her path.

Her time at the Lied Center sailed by! After departing Lincoln, Alex spent another month in the U.S., first heading to Washington, D.C. where she met with the other 250 members of the Young Leaders of the Americas who had worked in cities across this U.S. She was in a competition with the other YLAI Fellows, and was one of 10 fellows selected to pitch her project idea to the 250 peers attending the national meeting in D.C. While in D.C. she visited with our colleagues who work in the Kennedy Center Education Department and learned more about their national networks. After D.C., Alex traveled to New York City and met with colleagues at IBEX Puppetry and the Lincoln Center.

Alex's trip to Nebraska and her time in the U.S. was paid for by the U.S. Department of State. We are extremely thankful for this opportunity to bring this young leader to our community and to help effect change in Lincoln and at the Lied Center. While the project primarily emphasized Alex's goals and learning, we know that most of the learning that took place was realized by us, the Lied staff with whom she regularly interacted, and whose hearts are forever changed. She had so much to share with all of us. We can't wait to see what she cooks up for her next Nebraska visit!
