The Grow a Show Program Brings A House Divided to the Carson Theater

On September 17-22, more than 1,300 people experienced the world premiere play A House Divided in the Carson Theater. Produced as part of the Lied Center's Grow a Show program, this new work by Christina Kirk examined the bitter political and personal divisions in the Lincoln White House when Mary Todd Lincoln's Confederate half sister came to visit during the height of the Civil War.

The Lied Center has a long history of supporting and creating new work as part of the Grow A Show Program, and over the years the Lied has commissioned, created, and partnered on dozens of theatrical, dance, and musical compositions.

Executive Director Bill Stephan, who chose to produce the play after attending a first reading in November of 2023, said, "Abraham Lincoln used the phrase 'a house divided' in his famous speech known as the 'House Divided Speech,' delivered on June 16, 1858. The phrase is a reference from the Bible, Matthew 12:25 in which Jesus says, 'Every kingdom divided against itself is brought to desolation, and every city or house divided against itself shall not stand.' I hope this play may help bring our community and potentially our nation together in that spirit of unity Abraham Lincoln so believed in. Keep an eye on this new work, as you may see it on stages in New York, Chicago, or Los Angeles in the future."



In addition to the show, the Lied Center also presented a panel discussion and lecture featuring celebrated author and Civil War expert Dr. Jeremi Suri called A House Divided: Politics Today and American History, diving deeper into the topics presented in the play.

Lied Summer Camps Transform Lives



Lied Center Triple Threat Broadway Intensive

The 2024 Lied Center Triple Threat Broadway Intensive program was a transformative experience for its 50 participants, who ranged from high school freshmen to college freshmen. Our esteemed featured teaching artist, Ryan Scott Oliver, as well as Sam Hartley and Reynel Reynaldo, led students from Nebraska and surrounding states in a top-tiered training experience in musical theatre. Feedback from the intensive was overwhelmingly positive, with participants highlighting the value of honest feedback, personal growth, and new skills gained. Notably, 100% of eligible participants expressed intentions to return next summer, reflecting the program's profound impact. Scholarships also played a key role, offering full tuition and housing support to select students.



Lied Center Piano Academy

The 2024 Lied Center Piano Academy hosted 17 participants, ranging from high school freshmen to college freshmen. Under the guidance of our featured teaching artist, Eldred Marshall, as well as distinguished teaching artists like Paul Barnes and Mark Clinton from UNL, students gained valuable insights into piano technique, collaborative playing, and new repertoire. Feedback from participants was overwhelmingly positive, with many noting the unique opportunity to connect with fellow pianists and improve their skills. Additionally, scholarships provided full tuition and housing for select students, and 100% of eligible participants plan to return next year.



Grow a Show Musical Theatre Workshop Returns for 2024

The Lied Center's Grow a Show Musical Theatre Workshop returned for 2024, hosting staged readings of two original musicals with potential for Broadway success. These workshops have been held in previous years (2013, 2015, 2017, and 2019). A panel of award-winning experts, including writer Robert L. Freedman, music director/producer Jason Michael Webb, and producer Kevin Bannerman, provided feedback to the creators of the selected musicals.

The Lincoln community was invited to attend these free performances on September 9 and 10 at 7:30 PM. Each evening featured a first act reading, followed by expert feedback. Performances were held at the Lied Center Mainstage.

Monday, September 9 featured the musical Tales From The Comic Book Crackdown written by Benjamin Dickow and Ray Hedgpeth. The musical centers on the 1954 Senate hearings aimed at dismantling the comic book industry, focusing on Bill Gaines, publisher of Tales from the Crypt and The Vault of Horror, and his defense of comic books. This musical featured a mixture of cast of UNL students as well as local community performers and was directed by UNL Johnny Carson School of Theatre and Film chair Hank Stratton, with Kaleb Wilkening providing music direction, and Brad Buffum as stage manager. 408 people attended the Monday performance.

Tuesday, September 10 featured the musical *The God Machine* written by Matthew McCollum. This musical tells the story of John Murray Spear, an abolitionist preacher who left his church for Spiritualism, culminating in his creation of a "mechanical messiah" that ultimately failed. The story is seen through the eyes of a mysterious follower named Mother Mary. This musical featured a mixture of cast of UNL students as well as local community performers and was directed by UNL Johnny Carson School of Theatre and Film faculty member Ann Marie Pollard, with music direction by Mollie Manner, and stage management by Emma Jorgenson. 179 people attended the performance.

In total, 587 audience members attended Grow a Show, a workshop record!
