ARTS ACROSS NEBRASKA

February was a month to mark major milestones in Nebraska history. Not only did the Lied Center celebrate the 150th anniversary of the University of Nebraska, but we celebrated another major Nebraska achievement as well: the 100th anniversary of the publication of My Ántonia by Willa Cather. To acknowledge the anniversary, the Lied Center partnered with Illusion Theater Company of Minneapolis to tour a new theatrical adaptation of My Ántonia around the state as part of our Arts Across Nebraska program.

The production arrived in Lincoln in early February for a short run of public and school shows in the Lied Center's Johnny Carson Theater. After a string of sold out shows in Lincoln, the production packed up and hit the road for its tour, heading to Kearney, then Scottsbluff, and finally concluding in Willa Cather's hometown of Red Cloud.

Nebraskans absolutely loved the theatrical version of Cather's most popular novel. Even the multiple blizzards the cast and crew encountered during the tour couldn't keep the audiences away. Over the course of the statewide tour, we reached 1,172 students between 6th-12th grades through school matinees and classroom workshops. We also reached 800 adults through public performances across the state.

Though the cast and crew had to contend with three blizzards during their time touring across Nebraska, it was a successful tour. Public audiences were somewhat smaller than hoped for due to blizzard conditions on show nights, but those who came were enamored with the performance and grateful for the opportunity to be immersed in the story of Ántonia, Jim Burden and life on the plains in the 1800s.
